Job Purpose: Under guidance of the Head of Undergraduate Medicine,

and working in cooperation with the Phase and Course Leads, the post holder will have responsibility for strategy, organisation, and delivery of planned teaching around pharmacology, clinical prescribing and therapeutics in both undergraduate and postgraduate curricula at the

School of Medicine.

Principal Accountabilities:

- To deliver teaching and facilitate student-led learning activities at both undergraduate and postgraduate level on clinical pharmacology, prescribing and therapeutics. This will include the development of online resources, to ensure coverage across the undergraduate curriculum consistent with the knowledge base and competencies described in the Medical Licensing Assessment (MLA) content map.
- 2. To work in cooperation with external placement providers to ensure the consistent delivery of placement-based teaching around clinical pharmacology, prescribing and therapeutics including student preparation for the Prescribing safety Assessment (PSA)
- 3. To work with the Assessment Lead in designing and quality assuring exam items inclusing SBA questions and OSCE stations related to clinical pharmacology, prescribing and therapeutics.
- 4. To be responsible for developing all school of medicine clinical pharmacology, prescribing and therapeutics curriculum needs in conjunction with phase/year and course leads.
- 5. To maintain currency as a practitioner through appropriate links with regulators, clinical employers and external professional bodies, as agreed with your Line Manager.
- 6. To be available onsite to be an assessor for OSCE examinations and other assessment-based activities.
- 7. To act as a personal development tutor (PDT), providing advice, guidance and support to students.
- 8. Contribute to planning and implementation of strategic areas such as student recruitment, marketing, quality assurance and student retention.
- 9. Work with colleagues to improve and enrich the experience of our students. Contribute to local plans in response to NSS outcomes.
- 10. Take a pro-active role in the recruitment and supervision of undergraduate and postgraduate students and undertake associated duties including preparation, marking and administration.
- 11. Contribute to curriculum development by identifying the need for review of current provision and designing and developing course proposals.
- 12. Work to achieve our vision and values in respect of widening participation, equality of opportunity, commitment to the health and safety of students and colleagues and the delivery of high quality education provision.

- 13. Contribute to external income generation, including research, consultancy, and networking, and the identification and development of new market opportunities for the Department and the Faculty.
- 14. Comply with Data Protection Act 2018 and GDPR requirements in all working practices maintaining confidentiality, integrity, availability, accuracy, currency and security of information as appropriate. Take personal responsibility for all personal data within own working environment.
- 15. Such other duties temporarily or on a continuing basis, as may reasonably be required, commensurate with your grade.
