Job purpose: To undertake a range of teaching, research,

Principal Accountabilities:

- 1. Lead teaching and related activities in areas of supply chain management or operations management, drawing on own area(s) of expertise in these fields.
- 2. Work with the Assistant Principal and colleagues to develop new curricula and proactively engage in course validation activities.
- 3. Undertake academic management responsibilities including module and course leadership and acting as a personal tutor.
- 4. Engage with external networks via activities including working as an external examiner, validation panel member, assessment panels and award boards, as appropriate.
- 5. Monitor student progression, identifying and supporting at an early stage those students requiring guidance and support, with assistance from our Student Advisers, as appropriate.
- 6. Work closely with academic colleagues, learning technologists and computing-related support staff.
- 7. Engage in recruitment and admissions activities, including interviews, clearing, open events and other promotional events.



- 8. Work to achieve our vision and values in respect of widening participation, equality of opportunity, commitment to the health and safety of students and colleagues and the delivery of high quality education provision.
- 9. Contribute to research and consultancy in the Faculty including initiating and implementing plans for external income generation/third stream funding.
- 10. Contribute to quality assurance procedures including periodic reviews, approvals and annual monitoring.
- 11. Take a lead role in your areas of expertise by working with employers and other external organisations on planning and implementing community and regional projects and ensuring compatibility of collaborative provision.
- 12. Maintain currency through active links with industry, external professional bodies and/or practice as agreed with your Line Manager.
- 13. Work to achieve our vision and values in respect of widening participation, equality of opportunity, commitment to the health and safety of students and colleagues and the delivery of high-quality education provision.
- 14. Comply with Data Protection Act 2018 and GDPR requirements in all working practices maintaining confidentiality, integrity, availability, accuracy, currency and security of information as appropriate. Take personal responsibility for all personal data within own working environment.
- 15. Such other duties temporarily or on a continuing basis, as may reasonably be required, commensurate with your grade.
